

ABSTRACT

Suriani, 2022. The Effect of Gadgets Used on Students' Learning Outcomes in Civics Learning Elementary School Cluster VI, Pallangga District, Gowa Regency, Supervised by Muhammad Basri and Rosleny B.

This study aimed at determining the impact of using gadgets on students' learning outcomes in Civics Learning at Class V SD Inpres Watu-Watu Pallangga District, Gowa Regency. This research was conducted at SD Inpres Watu-Watu Pallangga District, Gowa Regency. The research approach was quantitative. This type of research was a quasi-experimental control pretest-posttest design. The population in this study were all students in cluster VI, Pallangga district. Sampling technique using random sampling. The samples in this study were class V SD Inpres Watu-Watu with total 29 students as the experimental class and class V SD Negeri Taipale'leng with 28 students as the control class. This type of data collection deployed pretest and posttest questions to measure student learning outcomes. Questionnaires were used to investigate the subjects' opinion regarding learning outcomes (Y) after being given treatment in the form of using Gadget media (X). The data analysis technique used was the analysis of the difference test / t-test which was previously tested for normality and homogeneity,

The result of this research: (1) Students' learning outcomes before and after using gadgets in Civics learning in Cluster VI Elementary Schools, Pallangga District, Gowa Regency have increased from 62.50 to 81.07. (2) The use of gadgets in Civics learning influences the learning outcomes of elementary school students in Cluster VI, Pallangga District, Gowa Regency. This can be seen from the observation of student activities which have increased from good category (B) to very good category (A). (3) The learning outcomes of students after the post-test in the experimental class were higher than in the control class. Therefore, using gadgets in Civics learning can improve the learning outcomes of elementary school students in Cluster VI, Pallangga District, Gowa Regency.
